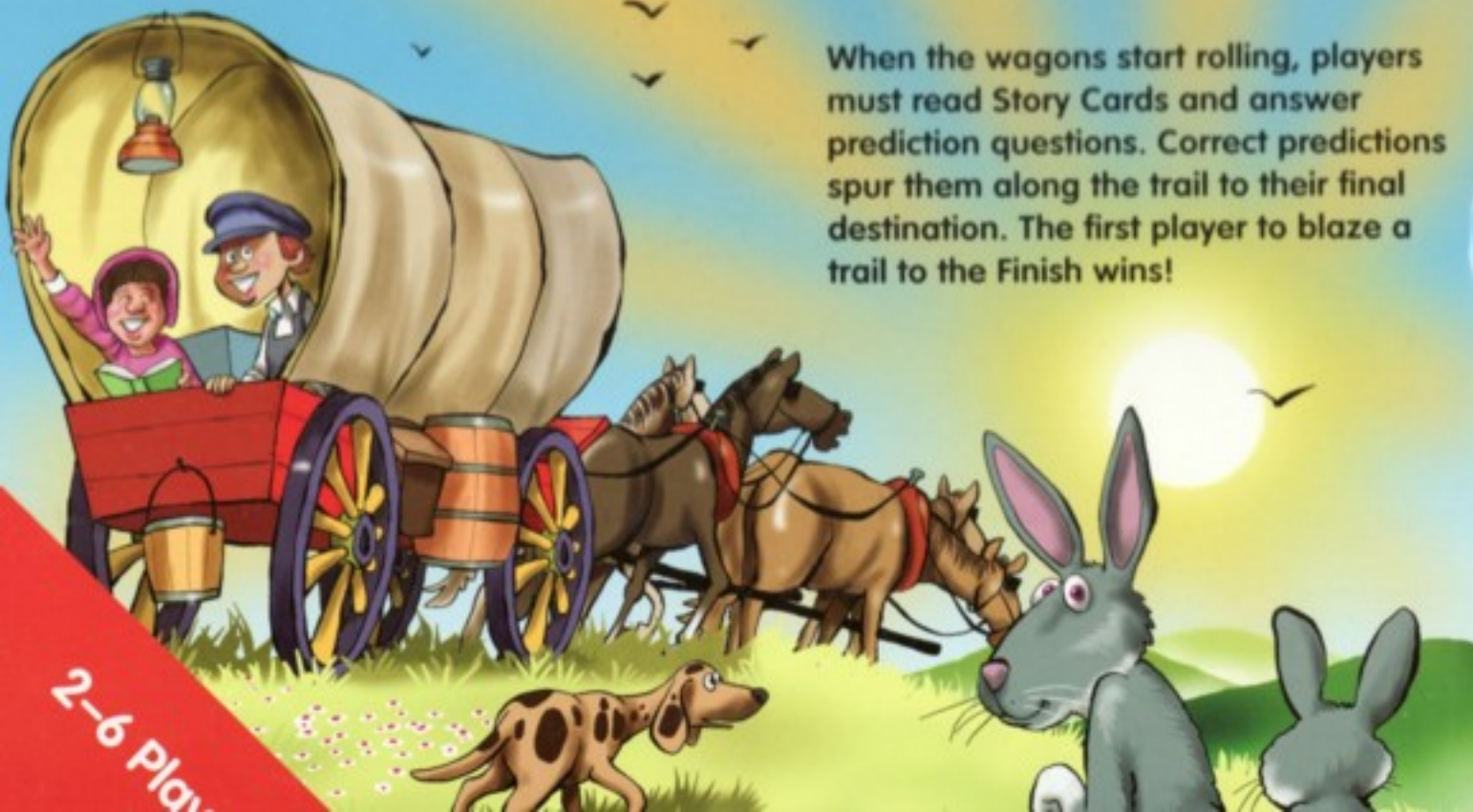


# Predicting Outcomes

## WESTERN FRONTIER

When the wagons start rolling, players must read Story Cards and answer prediction questions. Correct predictions spur them along the trail to their final destination. The first player to blaze a trail to the Finish wins!

2-6 Players



Students will want to saddle up and read for their journey West!

Easy directions allow for more learning time!

As they take to the trails, players must be ready to predict what might happen. To continue their journey, players roll the die and read Story Cards that ask them to make a prediction after reading a leveled passage.

Correct answers spur players closer to the end of the trail. The first player to reach the Finish and correctly answer a final question wins!

Learning Well games let students focus on learning!

1. Winning is based on knowledge and skills, not random factors.
2. Games address important content, not trivia.
3. Graphics and content are high-interest and directions are easy to understand, so as not to restrict learning opportunities.
4. Players never lose points for wrong answers.
