





# Reading Between the Lines

## Fantasyland

Reading levels:  
Red: 2.0–3.5  
Blue: 3.5–5.0  
Green: 5.0–6.5



Students will find the magic in reading between the lines!

### Easy directions allow for more learning time!

Students explore Fantasyland aboard a sailing ship. They visit the Gnome Forest, the Dragon's Lair, and Unicorn Isle while reading and answering Story Cards. Story Cards ask them to read a leveled passage and choose the correct answer to a multiple-choice question by reading between the lines. The first player to sail to the Magic Castle and correctly answer a final Story Card wins.

### Learning Well games let students focus on learning!

1. Winning is based on knowledge and skills, not random factors.
2. Games address important content, not trivia.
3. Graphics and content are high-interest and directions are easy to understand, so as not to restrict learning opportunities.
4. Players never lose points for wrong answers.
