But the boy, who was called Little Gopher, was not without a gift of his own.


From an early age, he made toy warriors from scraps of leather and pieces of wood and he loved to decorate smooth stones with the red juices from berries he found in the hills.

The wise shaman of the tribe understood that Little Gopher had a gift that was special. "Do not struggle, Little Gopher.


Your path will not be the same as the others. They will grow up to be warriors.
