





Early in the morning of August 6, 1945, a big American bomber roars down the runway on a tiny island called Tinian. The pilot is Colonel Tibbets. He has named the plane after his mother, Enola Gay. On a routine mission, a B-29 would carry 4000 to 16,000 pounds of bombs. The Enola Gay is on a special mission. It carries a single

bomb. It is an atom bomb that weighs 8900 pounds. Everyone hopes the atom bomb will finally end a long and horrible war.



Four years before, on December 7, 1941, Japanese planes attacked American ships in Hawaii without warning. Caught by surprise, many ships and planes were wrecked at the naval base, Pearl Harbor. The United States declared war on Japan and Japan's ally, Germany. With other countries, they fight a war called World War II.

By 1945, Germany has given up. Only Japan fights on. But the United States has a secret weapon — the atom bomb. Nothing is as powerful and as awful. The atom bomb is so terrible that

the United States hopes it will make Japan stop fighting.



Two other bombers follow the Enola Gay. These planes only carry cameras and special instruments to measure the explosion. Together the three bombers turn over the Pacific Ocean and speed through the darkness toward Japan.
