


Have a Hamburger

Please Pass the Salt

Salt is made of sodium and chlorine. In chemistry, it is called sodium chloride. Sodium will burst into flames when it touches water. Chlorine is a gas that can kill people if they breathe it. When sodium and chlorine are mixed just right, we have salt. It doesn't catch on fire or poison us.

In fact, people must have a small amount of salt in their diet to stay alive. We know that we should not eat too much salt, though. It can cause us to get high blood pressure.

In early times, people used salt as money. It was called "salarium." Now we don't use it to buy things, but when we earn money, we are paid a "salary." The word "salary" comes from the old word "salarium."

Salt is not used to just season our food. It is used to keep food from spoiling, too. Salt is important in making medicine, plastic, glass, steel, and other things. The only mineral harder than salt is the diamond.



When winter comes, animals must find ways to take care of themselves. They do this in many different ways.


Many birds fly from their cold homes to places where it is warmer. They stay there until spring comes to their home land.

HOME-RUN HITTERS

Babe Ruth was the first great homerun hitter in baseball history. He started
playing Major League Baseball in 1914 with
the Baltimore Orioles. Later that year, he
joined the Boston Red Sox as a pitcher. He
pitched in two World Series with the Red Sox.
But he was an even greater hitter than he
was a pitcher. In 1920, the New York Yankees
paid \$125,000 for Babe Ruth. No one had
ever paid that much for a ball player. With
the Yankees, Babe gave up pitching. He
played in the outfield. Then he could put all
his effort into batting.

In 1927, Babe set a record by hitting 60 home runs in one season. During his baseball career, Babe Ruth hit 714 homers. That was a new record that was not to be broken for many years.

Babe Ruth ended his baseball career with the Boston Braves in 1935. In his final game, he hit three home runs. In 1938, Ruth coached the Brooklyn Dodgers for a short while. But he became ill and had to quit baseball altogether. He died in 1948 in New York.

During his career, Babe set more than 50 records. Many are still standing. In 1936, he was one of the first players to be elected to the Baseball Hall of Fame. Babe Ruth played baseball for 22 years.

Henry "Hank" Aaron broke Babe Ruth's home-run record in 1974. At the time, he was playing for the Atlanta Braves. The Braves were playing the Los Angeles Dodgers. Baseball fans all over the country were watching to see if he could hit his 715th home run to beat Babe Ruth's record. In his second time at bat, Henry Aaron drove the ball over the left-field wall. A new record was set.

By the time Aaron quit baseball in 1976, he had hit a total of 755 homers. He was an outfielder. He played with the Milwaukee Brewers and Atlanta Braves. In 1957, Aaron was named the most valuable player of the National League. In four different years, he led the National League in home runs hit in a season. He played baseball for 22 years. He also coached after he was no longer a player. Henry "Hank" Aaron is now a member of the Baseball Hall of Fame, and he is still an avid fan.

Sally Ride was the first American woman in space. She was also the youngest astronaut to travel to space. When she traveled to space she was only thirty-one years old. Sally Ride started training for her mission in 1978 at NASA in Houston, Texas. She went through rigorous astronaut training and then served as the "capcorn" for the space shuttle flight *Columbia*. As the "capcorn," Sally was the only person to talk to the astronauts while they were in space. She helped the astronauts monitor the different cockpit lights and kept the astronauts up-to-date on how the flight was going. When one of the astronauts aboard *Columbia* was describing to Sally Ride what Earth looked like from space, she responded, "Sounds great. When do I get my chance?" Sally Ride's own chance to view Earth from above came several years later when she traveled aboard *The Challenger* in April 1983.
