**Try This**

More than one answer may seem correct. Choose the answer that goes best with the story. Darken the circle for the correct answer.

**Sample A****Making Breakfast**

Dad and I made our own breakfast. We made pancakes. They tasted better than Mom's pancakes. Dad and I decided we would keep this as our little secret.

**Why will they keep the secret?**

- (A) They do not want Mom to know they cooked breakfast.
- (B) They do not want to hurt Mom's feelings.
- (C) They burned the pancakes.


**Think It Through**

The correct answer is B. They do not want to hurt Mom's feelings. The story states that the pancakes tasted better than Mom's pancakes. But they will keep this secret. If they tell Mom they might hurt her feelings.


**Try This**

More than one answer may seem correct. Choose the answer that goes best with the story. Darken the circle for the correct answer.

**Sample B****Vera and Kit**

Vera and Kit were playing. Kit ran to hide. Vera looked for her. Then it began to rain. Vera and Kit got wet. They ran to the house.

**What were the girls doing?**

- (A) playing football
- (B) playing hopscotch
- (C) playing hide-and-seeK


**Think It Through**

The correct answer is C. playing hide-and-seeK. The story states that Kit ran to hide. Then Vera looked for her. This is not how to play football. This is not how to play hopscotch.
