For example, Indy car racing has always used specially made race cars built from the ground up.



Unlike other sports with seasons of only a few months, NASCAR racing takes place almost all year long. The first race is in February. It's the big Daytona 500. The drivers have a chance to compete in thirty-five more races through November, racking up as many points as they can. They each hope to win the Nextel Cup, NASCAR's biggest prize! The champion claims the trophy and more than \$5 million in bonus money.
