Each weekly unit provides daily assessment activities.

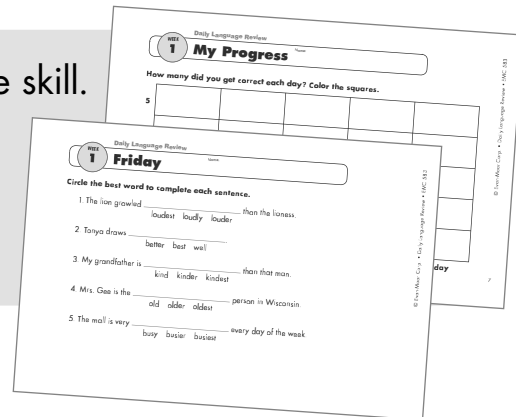
## Monday through Thursday

## Friday

- Students complete a daily progress record that tracks their work for the week.
