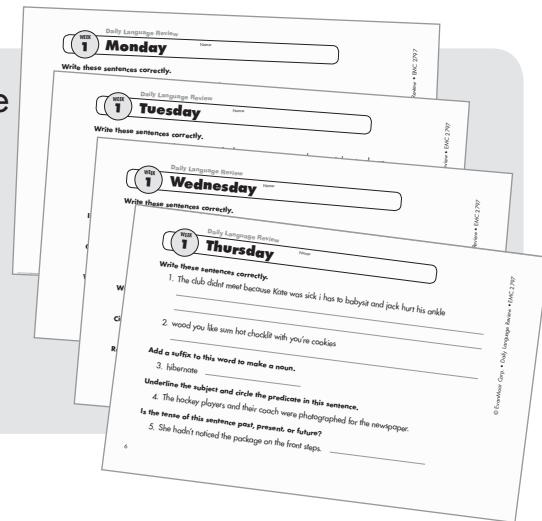

Each weekly unit provides daily assessment activities.

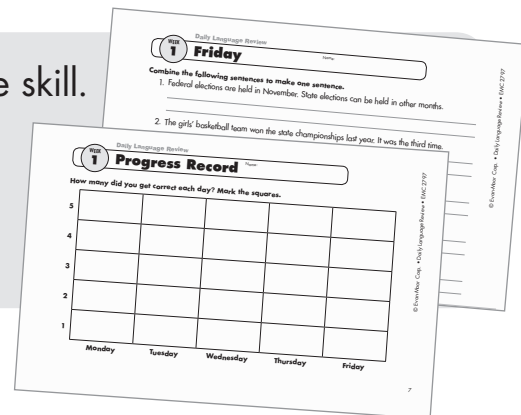
Monday through Thursday
